

For comparison, the population of Japan is 127 million, and the population of Slovakia is 5.5 million.








Interesting facts about Russia.

When it was built?


It was built in 1935 and it was the first underground system.

History: Fight at Stalingrad

- One of the important places during WW2 is Stalingrad.
- This fight was one of the most dangerous fights in history because around 1 200 000 people died during this fight, gone missing and wounded. On the Soviet side, about 1,050,000 people died, got injured or captured.
- Fight at Stalingrad started because if the communistic countries and Germany won this fight, they will have one of the most targeted places in WW2, and that's why Germany attacked and why its so dangerous.
- After Stalin died Stalingrad was renamed to Volgograd

Usually has meat in it, and it tastes better with cream.



Faberge Egg "Trans-Siberian railway"

The egg is carved from a solid piece of heliotrope jasper, covered with openwork gold ornaments, inlaid with diamonds and golden flowers. A wide gold border at the junction of the two halves of the egg is decorated with a ruby and two diamonds. The egg's button lock is crafted in the shape of a scarlet ruby. Interior decoration - green velvet.





1891 - an imperial Easter egg with a model of the cruiser "Memory of Azov"

This is an egg with a built-in clock, covered with pink enamel. The specimen was auctioned off for about \$ 14 million.

He also sold it afterwards to a private collection for \$ 33 million!
