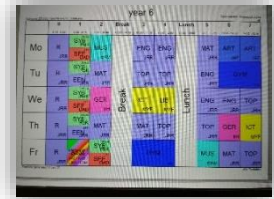
Introduction

Program Details :

1. Lessons are **generally** according to the regular school schedule
 - a. Primary class times are the same
 - i. 6 Lessons (8.30 until 2.30)
 - ii. Electives and clubs will continue
 - b. Breaks are included
 - i. They are for both student and teacher benefit
 - ii. Please honor them.
2. A class schedule will be sent out to students/parents before the week begins which includes links to the each of the online lessons (see SCHEDULE below)
 - a. Teachers will choose their platform for engagement for each lesson
 - b. At the lesson time, students need only to **CLICK** the lesson link on the schedule.

Tips on successful Home Learning: Our building is closed, our learning continues.

1. Please be ready to start each lesson on time. Be sure to have the necessary items just as you would in school. Pencil cases, notebooks, textbooks, etc.
2. It's best to have your Weekly Schedule on the apparatus you're using for lessons (PC, Mobile, Tablet). Therefore, it's only a click to enter the lesson.
3. Dress appropriately
4. Set aside a learning area. If possible, to have a space in your home that you can dedicate to learning, it is helpful. For those with less space, be creative with setting up an area that, at least decoratively, students can prepare mentally. Clear your area from distractions. Another suggestion is to wear clothing that is different than the rest of the day.
5. Routines – we recommend a consistent daily schedule outside of school time (8.30 – 14.30)
6. Attendance, homework, testing/assessments will continue as when the building is closed.
7. Please have regular contact with your teachers to assure continued development and improvement to the program.
8. Those classes that require printing, the school will provide printing and post support.
9. We recommend writing tablets that allow students to continue writing skills even while working with digital content.
10. We've added DocHub (: <https://dochub.com/>) to the student's Google Drive. An application that let's students work with, write on, and edit documents including PDF's.
