



DEMOGRAPHIC OF SOUTH KOREA The population of South Korea in 2020 was 51.78 million people and there is only a 0.1 percent annual change. The life expectancy of South Korea is about 83 years on average. The reason they live so long is because they are extremely healthy.



DEATH RATE & BIRTH RATE.


The death rate in South Korea was quite high in the 2000s and gradually got lower at the time of 2008, and started to rise at at 2020. The birth rate has been getting lower and lower. From 1960 6 children and now, In 2021, on average it's 1 child per family.



POPULATION GROWTH RATE


The population growth rate of South Korea has gradually lowered itself from 6.9% in 1960 to -1% in 2020.

this is a contracting population pyramid of South Korea, showing it is a developed country.

70/natural increase (-1%) = -70. This means, in 70 years the population of South Korea will half.




LIFE EXPECTANCY

The life expectancy of South Korea is 83 years old. This meant on average, a person is expected to live until around that age.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE

In 2019, the infant mortality rate in South Korea is 1.921 deaths per 1000 live births. Currently, the infant mortality rate is 1.982 per 1000 live births.
